ITV News		Commercial terrestrial TV news provider.
Cinema (e.g., Odeon Films)		Commercial films shown in cinemas.
Printed Magazines (e.g., Cosmopolitan)		Monthly print publications.
Tabloid Newspapers (e.g., The Sun)		Popular newspapers focused on sensational news.
Billboard Advertising		Large static advertisements in public places.
Local Newspapers (e.g., Yorkshire Post)		Regional print-based news.
TV Soap Operas (e.g., Coronation Street)		Long-running traditional television dramas.
TikTok		Short-form video-sharing app used globally.
YouTube		Video platform allowing users to upload content.
Instagram News Pages (e.g., @PoliticsJOE)		Social media accounts that provide news updates.
Twitter/X		Microblogging platform often used for real-time news.
Podcasts (e.g., The Social Breakdown)		Downloadable or streamed digital audio content.
Netflix		Subscription-based streaming platform.
